HISTORY OF SIGMA SIGMA CHAPTER

On October 16, 1995, Bro. Steve Taylor and Bro. George Jefferson, while attending the Million Man March in Washington, laid the foundation for the creation of Sigma Sigma Sigma Chapter (Tri-Sigma). Having been friends and fraternity brothers since their college days at Howard University, they reminisce on their college days and how they could bring their idea of a new chapter to fruition. They both shared a common interest in seeing Phi Beta Sigma challenged to adhere to its founding principles and greater transparency.

Anxious to get started on their endeavor, they deliberately recruited and welcomed other inactive Brothers from throughout the metropolitan area to support the establishment of another area chapter. For several months meetings were held in member homes, church meeting rooms, and at Black owned restaurants. A formal request for a chapter charter (initially for Washington, DC later modified to Montgomery County) was submitted to Marvin 'Doc' Cheatham, Eastern Regional Director on March 20, 1996.

On April 15, 1996 the charter members sponsored a special ceremony, to include the signing of 'Articles of Rededication by all charter members on the campus of Howard University. The "maze of paper bureaucracy" was skillfully navigated and formal approval for the chapter charter was gained on November of 1996. NOTE: The actual charter date was later backdated to May 3, 1996 and the chapter name provided to us (based on sequential order) was rejected and a new name, Sigma Sigma Sigma, was proposed and, ultimately, accepted.

- The Project GiveBack Community Service Organization began as a food drive in the offices of Thompson, Cobb, Bazilio and Associates. As a professional staff member of this Washington, DC based accounting firm, Ransom Miller, III collected cash donations and canned goods throughout the fall months of 1995, and distributed food baskets to 6 families and one homeless shelter the week of Thanksgiving. The support Mr. Miller received was extremely positive and inspired him to make this food drive an annual event. With hopes of gaining a wide range of support and in an effort to separate this project from others, Miller named the food drive Project GiveBack. Why is capturing Black Spend important?

• A dollar spends 28 days circulating in the Asian community; 19 days in the Jewish community; 17 days in predominately WASP communities; and 7 days in Hispanic communities. A dollar circulates for only 6 hours in the black community. In other words, when a Black person earns a dollar, it is typically not spent with a Blackowned business. 99% of our \$1.3 trillion buying power is spent outside of our community. Blacks spend less money in Black-owned businesses than other racial and ethnic groups spend in businesses owned by members outside of their groups. By changing nothing, nothing happens.

How can we become a Change Agent?

• While we continue to assist Black-owned businesses with development, promotion and growth, we are adding another layer that will document our Black Spend. The goal of this document is to assist our chapters from the International, Regional and State levels on how to effectively implement our Black Spend Initiative. As we promote and patronize these businesses with our financial support, we will document the spend. Black Spend dollars spent individually or collectively by the Chapters, Regions, and International levels will roll up to include a TOTAL Spend. Chapters will have the ability to insert this Black Spend Initiative amount on their PIA's going forward.
